WE ENGAGED THOUSANDS OF SUPPORTERS **IN WATERSHED-WIDE EVENTS!**

It was a busy year for collaboration with our community outreach partners, including:

•2016 Annual Celebration featuring the UPRIVER Film Screening •Discover Your Watershed Series – Backyard Bird Counts at Salmon Creek and Elijah Bristow State Park, Tire Mountain Wildflower Tour, Mushrooms of the Middle Fork, and Forest Management Tour: Private Lands in Lost Creek Basin

•Science Pubs - showcasing Chinook salmon, western pond turtles, and Townsend's bats

• Participation in watershed-wide events such as McKenzie River Trust's Living River Celebration, Oakridge-Westfir Tree Planting Festival with the Southern Willamette Forest Collabortive, The Great Willamette Cleanup, and Youth in Nature's Play in the Rain Day

OVER 60,000 NATIVE TREES AND SHRUBS PLANTED ALONG LOST CREEK CONFLUENCE WITH THE MIDDLE FORK!

We're in the process of actively restoring 62 acres of riparian areas in the Lost Creek basin, sourcing our native plants from local nurseries, removing invasives, and improving floodplain habitat. Getting a head start on our project at Dorris Ranch, we treated 38 acres of prairie and 21 acres of oak woodlands for invasive species. In Staley Creek, we staged 120 large trees (60 with attached rootwads) for floodplain restoration, and continued to monitor restoration effectiveness in the Little Fall Creek basin.

580 WATERSHED RANGERS STUDENTS PARTICIPATED IN 53 FIELD TRIPS, **GENERATING 1,120 SERVICE HOURS!**

Our students produced a record-breaking year for community service hours including restoration plantings and invasive removal projects. We also launched the Watershed Stewards high school pilot program in Oakridge, while Watershed Rangers realeased an estimated 700 Chinook salmon through a new Eggs to Fry partnership with ODFW.


